ACT TEST - ADAPTIVE COGNITIVE TEST

The ACT is a psychometric aptitude test. The ACT provides a measure of the overall cognitive ability of the person being evaluated, based on their ability to solve logical operations of a non-verbal nature. The test is "adaptive" since the system selects questions based on the person's previous answers.

PSYCHOMETRIC QUALITIES

- Norms: The ACT was validated in 2019 with a normative sample of 488 adults in a variety of job types (administrative, trade, technical, professional, and management).
- ▶ Reliability: The internal consistency of the overall score (based on Cronbach's alpha coefficients) is 0.82.
- ▶ Validity: Correlation coefficients between ACT scores and those of other recognized ability tests range from 0.73 to 0.82 (convergent validity).
